IV) Alternatives to Incarceration:

- A) Goals: Keep people out of the criminal justice system as much as possible
- 1) Increase public safety by
 - a) Increasing opportunities for treatment
 - b) Increasing opportunities for training and skill development

B) Objectives to complete to support the Alternatives to Incarceration Goals:

- 1) Advocate for increased community based care to decrease the probability individuals become part of the criminal justice system
 - a) Support Triage Program development (support the county program: \$1.88M to build screening facility)
 - i) Meet with Thurston County Public Health and Social Services Dept Director Don Sloma to learn his recommendations
 - b) Advocate increased funding for treatment instead of incarceration
 - i) Support increased funding for community mental health centers
 - (1) Determine whether state or feds fund and lobby appropriate entity to increase funding
 - (2) Find local allies to build coalition
 - (3) And all other programs
 - ii) Support increased funding mental health inpatient care
 - c) Advocate to increase community support for mental health care by making others aware that those challenged by mental illness and drug addiction are being punished for their diseases, instead of getting needed treatment and help.
