How does this happen?

Church leadership, the staff, the congregation, the building and your financial support provide the foundation for our community. The annual stewardship campaign addresses the financial part of our engagement. Each year the Board sets goals based on an evaluation of current and anticipated financial needs. This year's pledge goal is \$593,440, which represents a 7.9% increase over last year's request.

Beyond sustaining the current level of quality programing, this amount will enable us to address the following identified needs:

- Add administrative support for digital communications, the Board, Committees and Teams, taking pressure off those staff and community members trying to do too much.

- Create a part-time staff position to support new and existing member and visitor engagement.
- Ensure that staff health insurance benefits are just and equitable for all eligible staff.
- Add funds to the reserve fund to maintain the beauty of OUUC's buildings and grounds.
- Continue to offer two Sunday morning worship services beyond June, so there is room in the sanctuary to welcome all who wish to attend on-site.

Making the Pledge Decision

This is a very personal decision based on many factors. All levels of giving are welcome and appreciated!

We ask you to carefully consider the role of the church in your life and the value that it currently adds, along with the knowledge that increased investment will strengthen our ability to serve our current level of programming and address growing community needs.
